I started working as a volunteer for Home from Home in 2010 after I retired. Since this time conditions for the kids and activities have changed a lot.

In the first years, the <u>computer room</u> at the day-care centre was open and functional. So, kids from various homes in the area would hang out there, mainly having fun with games. I thus started ways to use these PCs to further their learning. I got educational material from friends that I could install and I found selected websites which the kids could use online. With some of these, you are able to monitor their progress from your computer at home. I prepared a list of useful links to learning websites where they could solve maths or other tasks according to grade.

Starting the library, I checked the available book donations. Most of the books reflected life in Great Britain and are written in English. My aim was to enhance the focus of the topic to life in townships as well as to the children's, like losing parents, illnesses, bullying. Many books dealing with the children's life in a township are published in South Africa. Biblionef is a specialised source to get books with regard to these topics as well as in any of the official South African languages. I bought many books in English as well as in isiXhosa. I found the Western Cape government's holiday reading lists for the children. I bought a lot of books of these lists. I got a big box of children's books in isiXhosa donated by a friend of a friend in Cape Town.

During these years, many kids came to the combined computer room and library for doing their homework. That is when I bought the appropriate books like children's dictionaries and workbooks on various subjects, based on the national curricula. That was where the need for the library became even more obvious. I used to help individual kids with improving their reading skills. One-on-one they are less shy than in a group.

Together with an assistant I organized a spelling competition. The children prepared for that during the week before. We offered them YouTube videos where native speakers read the words in English.

Since the start of the tutoring programme, this is no longer necessary. The library, however, could still be used by the tutors. The catalogue makes it easy to find out what is there and the category markers help in finding them.

Also, during these years, there were no holiday activities. I started a lot of these e.g.

knitting classes,
making pizzas,
painting easter eggs,
folding paper into boxes or Christmas decoration,
making jewelery,
baking Christmas cookies,
movie time,
excursions to the beach.


These activities stopped when Home from Home offered holiday and extra mural activities for the children.

Up to 5 teenagers could work at the same time. I could watch them at my computer. I could watch them from Germany as well. But they worked only when I was there. They gave up finally.




